Basketball

Lady Caribs played four games in the past eight days with a 2-2 record. They twice defeated the Sentinel All-Stars, winning 59-32 on January 18th and 57-44 on the 22nd. The Lady Caribs, however, lost to the Lady Truckers [65-62] on the 15th and to the Lady Angels [69-46] on the 20th. Shadelle and Deandra Williams led the scoring attack for the Lady Caribs averaging 15 and 14 pts respectively. The Lady Caribs will be back in action on Saturday night as they chase a spot in this year's playoff against the league leaders, Lady Cheetahs at 7:30pm at the D W Davis Gym.

The men's team suffered two disappointing losses on the 15th to the Forbes Pros [117-102] and on the 19th to the Commonwealth Bank Giants [91-56]. Garvin Lightbourne and Dion McPhee led the team's scores. The Caribs are back in action tonight against the Y Care Wreckers at 7pm at the C I Gibson Gym.
