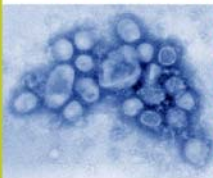
INTERESTED IN LUNCH WITH THE PRESIDENT?

Junior guard Deandra Williams hit a three point shot with seven seconds left on the clock to beat Johns & Wales University on Friday night. COB won the game 49-48 in dramatic fashion. The Lady Caribs; however, lost its second game to the three time NAIA Sun Conference champs Northwood University 81-30 on Saturday afternoon. For the Lady Caribs, Williams and freshman guard Gabrielle McKinney were the leading scorers in the two games.

COB men's team lost both of its games this weekend. On Friday, they lost to Florida College 88-75 and on Saturday they lost to Ave Marie University 71-49. Senior guard Garvin Lightbourne and freshman guard Devon Clarke led the team in scoring.

Both teams will play again November 20-22 in Florida. The women will play Ave Marie University on November 20 and St. Thomas University on November 21, while the men will play Northwood University on November 21 and Johnson & Wales University on November 22.

Both our men and women's basketball teams will begin play in the local leagues this week and will use those games as tune up for its series of intercollegiate games.
