Call for Papers

***The International Journal of Bahamian Studies* is a new journal to be published by The College of the Bahamas in 2010. It will build on the work of its predecessors, The College of The Bahamas Research Journal (COB-RJ) (2001-2009) and College Forum (1980-1997).** The IJBS will appear annually as a multi-disciplinary, open-access journal. It will accept original articles from all academic disciplines pertaining to The Bahamas—including, but not limited to, literature, political science, economics, psychology, comparative studies, music, law, education, the natural sciences, religion, linguistics.

Following peer-review, accepted manuscripts will be published in the next available volume. **Manuscripts should be received before April 30, 2010.**

IJBS welcomes manuscripts from prospective authors to be submitted on-line. Using the Open Journal Systems electronic submission system, authors can track their manuscript through the review, revision and publication process. Please register on the IJBS website.

Types of papers

Short Communications: Short communications are brief articles describing experiments, observations, commentaries, innovative methods or techniques or may be used for reporting research-in-progress. Short communications are limited to 2 to 6 printed pages and are subject to Editorial Review.

Original articles: Original articles are research articles based on scientific and sustained analytic enquiry. Research of Bahamian and comparative interest is welcomed. The length of a full paper should be the minimum required to describe and interpret the work clearly. Articles will be subject to blind peer-review.

Reviews: Submissions of literature reviews and perspectives covering topics of Bahamian interest are welcome and encouraged. Reviews should be concise and no longer than 6-10 printed pages. Review manuscripts may also be solicited. All reviews are subject to peer-review.

Book and Media Reviews: Book and media reviews of scholarly Bahamian interest will be included. They will be subject to Editorial Review only.

Open-Access Policy: *The International Journal of Bahamian Studies* is committed to providing open access to its content on the principle that making research freely available on the Internet supports a greater global exchange of knowledge.
