Call for Papers - Volume 17 (2011)

***The International Journal of Bahamian Studies* is a peer-reviewed research journal published by The College of the Bahamas.** It previously published under the title *The College of The Bahamas Research Journal* (2001-2009) and *College Forum* (1980-1997). The IJBS is an annual, multi-disciplinary, open-access journal. It accepts original articles from all academic disciplines including, but not limited to, political science, economics, psychology, comparative studies, music, law, education, the natural sciences, religion, and linguistics. Articles must be about the Bahamas or address issues relevant to the Bahamian archipelago.

Manuscripts should follow the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (APA style), 6th ed. Following peer-review, accepted manuscripts will be published in the next available volume.

IJBS welcomes manuscripts from prospective authors to be submitted on-line on the Journal's website or sent directly to the Managing Editor (e-mail address below).

Short Communications and Commentaries: Short communications are brief articles describing experiments, observations, innovative methods or techniques or may be used for reporting research-in-progress. Commentaries are essays on current issues. Short communications and commentaries may be up to 29 printed pages in length and are subject to editorial review.

Original articles: Original articles are research articles based on scientific and sustained analytic enquiry. The length of a full paper should be the minimum required to describe and interpret the work clearly. Articles will be subject to blind peer-review.

Reviews: Submissions of substantive critical literature reviews and perspectives covering topics of Bahamian interest are welcome and encouraged. Reviews should be concise and no longer than 6-10 printed pages. Review manuscripts may also be solicited.

Book and Media Reviews: Book and media reviews of Bahamian interest will be welcomed. They will be subject to editorial review only.

Open-Access Policy: *The International Journal of Bahamian Studies* is committed to providing open access to its content on the principle that making research freely available on the Internet supports a greater global exchange of knowledge.

Deadline: Papers may be submitted at any time throughout the year. The final date for submission for consideration for publication in Volume 17 is May 15, 2011.
